

COMPARATIVES

We use comparatives to compare **2** people, places, or things.

SHORT ADJECTIVES

When an adjective is short (1 or 2 syllables) we use **-ER THAN**.

happy → happier than



Mary is **happier** than Ann.

sad → sadder than



Ann is **sadder** than Mary.

LONG ADJECTIVES

When an adjective is long (2+ syllables) we use **MORE THAN** / **LESS THAN**.

adorable → more adorable than



dangerous → less dangerous than

The bunny is less dangerous than the shark.
