Who

'Who' is a subject to a verb

Who – he/she

Example:

Who was calling me?

Whom

'Whom' is an object in a sentence.

Whom – him/her

Example:

From whom did you get my number?

Who and Whom

A pronoun is a word that may take the place of one or more nouns.

Who is used when the pronoun is the subject of the interrogative sentence.

Whom is used when the pronoun is the object of the verb.
