

Rewrite the sentences without changing their meaning. I'm giving you some hints in brackets😊.

1. Dan enjoyed the party. He didn't thank the host

. ("in spite of" is followed by an -ing verb)

In spite of

2. It was such a difficult exercise! I couldn't do it.

(too+adjective+for+person+to+infinitive)

The exercise was too

3. My sister's hair is too long. She's going to the hairdresser's on Monday.

(Use the CAUSATIVE)

My sister is

4. Carol didn't revise for the exam, so she got a really bad mark.

(think of the conditional type we use when we refer to PAST EVENTS)

If Carol

5. These clocks are made in Singapore.

(The sentence given is the PASSIVE VOICE)

They

6. Scientists believe that global warming affects every country.

(USE THE IMPERSONAL PASSIVE)

Global warming

7. Sally hasn't phoned us for two weeks.

(NEGATIVE PRESENT PERFECT + FOR + PERIOD OF TIME = IT'S + PERIOD OF TIME + SINCE + PAST SIMPLE)

It's

8. This is Mr Brown. His daughter lives in Australia.

(Use a RELATIVE clause, remember that you have to decide whether it should be defining or non-defining)

This is Mr Brown

9. Let's have a party to celebrate Pam's graduation next month.

(Think of the different kinds of making SUGGESTIONS. On Classroom, I have just uploaded some notes about reporting suggestions where you can find them)

10. "The teacher will get angry if we don't do the homework she gave us yesterday"

(REPORTED SPEECH)

Mary said

11. Where are the books? I borrowed them from the school library.

(RELATIVE CLAUSE)

12. It's a pity I missed U2's concert last Friday.

(We use **I wish + past perfect** for regretting or complaining about the past)

I wish

13. If I were you, I wouldn't smoke so much.

(Think of a different way of giving ADVICE or expression opinion)

You'd

14. "Why don't we cook dinner instead of eating out tonight?"

(SUGGESTIONS)

Patrick suggested

15. It's three years since we last met Tom's family.

(NEGATIVE PRESENT PERFECT + FOR + PERIOD OF TIME = IT'S + PERIOD OF TIME + SINCE + PAST SIMPLE)

We

16. "Don't spend so much time watching TV, Jane. You must write your essay for next Tuesday."

(Reported Speech: Think of a conjunction to put together these two sentences)

Mum told

17. "I'm sorry, Mr Jones, I didn't want to disturb you! (

Reported Speech: Think of the preposition that follows the verb "apologise")

Dan apologised

18. My brother could swim well when he was only six.

(WORD TRANSFORMATION: Think of the noun that comes from "swim")

My brother was

19. Tony cleared the table. Then he did the washing up.

(VERB TENSE: Think of the verb tense that expresses an action that happened before another past action)

After

20. Candy enjoyed pasta when she was a child, but now she hates it.

(VERB TENSE: Think of the expression we use to talk about actions that were habitual in the past but no anymore, or states that were true in the past but not now)

Candy

21. The hurricane is thought to have damaged some buildings in the area.

(The sentence given is in the IMPERSONAL PASSIVE VOICE)

The experts

22. I've never eaten such delicious salmon before.

(Think of SUPERLATIVE ADJECTIVES)

23. Hurry up or we'll miss the last train.

(Think of conditional sentences we use to talk about situations that are likely to happen)

If

24. Let me show you a photo of the park. I took it last summer.

(Put the two sentences together adding a RELATIVE PRONOUN)

25. Do you want me to iron the clothes for you?

(Think of a way to OFFER to do something for someone)

Shall

26. Water the plants every week or they will dry up.

(CONDITIONALS: What will happen IF you DON'T water the plants?)

Unless

27. My parents don't let me go to the disco next Saturday.

(Think of a way to express PROHIBITION or LACK OF PERMISSION)
