### Reading “A feast for the eyes”

We have enjoyed art created from clay, paint, metal and stone. But Carl Warner, a British artist and photographer, does things differently. He uses food to create what he calls “foodscapes”. He goes to supermarkets and groceries to buy art supplies. He imitates real landscapes by combining different types of food. After that, he photographs them. One amazing piece of his work is called “Carts and Balloons”. It's a countryside scene. He uses leafy green stalks of broccoli as trees in a forest and a few pieces of bread to make a cart. He uses some potatoes and berries as rocks and some yellow sweetcorn and cucumbers for the fields. He makes, from bunches of bananas and some fruit, hot-air balloons that float in the sky. Clouds are made of white bread. It might seem a little weird to use food in creating art, but Carl thinks it will encourage children to eat healthy food.
