

Looks, (feels smells etc), looks like, feels like, smells like, etc, looks as if, feels as if, smells as if etc

If it precedes a **noun** – cabbage, strawberries, thunder, a herd of elephants, use **the sense word + like**

If it precedes an **adjective** – damp, sick, cold, unhappy, terrible, awful, use **the sense word on its own**

If it precedes a **phrase** – it is going to rain, it is damp, the food is burning, she is sick, it is going to get cold, she is unhappy, there is going to be a thunderstorm, she is struggling, it is lost, you are being murdered, use **the sense word + like OR the sense word + as if**
