In time [ɪn taɪm]

– «до истечения крайнего срока» или до самого последнего момента.

✓ They made it just in time to the hospital before she gave birth. – Они успели вовремя как раз до того, как она родила.

✓ We arrived just in time for the start of the concert. – Мы приехали как раз к началу концерта.

On time [ɒn taɪm]

– «не раньше, не позже; точно вовремя».

✓ I would like to start the lesson on time today at 9am so please don't be late. – Я бы хотел сегодня начать урок вовремя в 9, поэтому, пожалуйста, не опаздывайте.

✓ She's never on time, I can't believe how disorganised she is. – Она никогда не приходит вовремя, не пойму, почему она такая неорганизованная.
