Narrative tenses are verb tenses that are used to talk about the past. They are often found in stories and descriptions of past events, such as personal anecdotes.

The basic tense for telling a story is the **Past Simple tense** which has several uses.

1. **Completed actions.** We see this succession of events happen and come to completion.

The **Past Continuous** is our past in motion. There are several uses for this tense as well, and these are the three that are, probably, the most important for our purposes.

1. **Interrupted action.** This is where we use the past continuous as background to a more important or dramatic event, which is in the past.

2. **Atmosphere.** To describe the situation in which the events of the narrative occurred. It gives us a sense of action or movement in the scene.

The **Past Perfect** tells us what happened **BEFORE** the events we're already reading about in the past.

The **Past Perfect Continuous** is used for longer activities that were happening continuously up until a specified time in the past.
