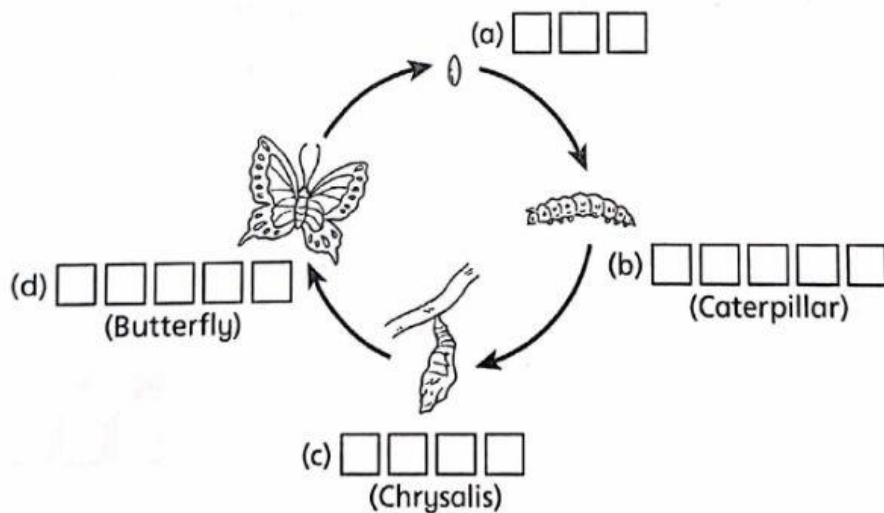


22. The eggs of a cockroach are laid in an egg case which is usually found in a , sheltered and warm place to a food source.
23. A nymph resembles the adult cockroach but is smaller in and does not have .
24. The nymph eats a lot and several times as it develops.
25. The adult cockroach is fully developed and moulting. It has wings and can fly.

Life cycle of a butterfly

26. The life cycle of a butterfly consists of four stages. They are the egg, larval, pupal and adult stages.



27. The eggs of a butterfly are usually found on the of leaves. The leaves are the food source for the caterpillars.
28. Each egg is protected by a shell.
29. A caterpillar eats a lot and several times as it develops.
30. The caterpillar changes into a which attaches itself to a twig or a leaf.
31. The pupa stops eating, develops and grows into an adult butterfly.
32. The adult butterfly comes out of the case. It waits for its wings to dry before flying off.
