


## Modal auxiliaries (p. 147)

**can / can't / could / should / may and must**



**Test yourself! Choose the right word.**

1. I'm not hungry. I \_\_\_\_\_ eat now. (**must / can't**)

4. Mum, **can - can't - may - must** I go to the cinema with Holly? – Yes, of course.
5. These jeans are very old now. We **can - can't - may - must** buy some new jeans for you.
