We use **THERE IS** with

plural nouns

We use **THERE ARE** with

singular nouns

There **is / are** a cat on the roof.



There **is / are** two birds in the tree.



There **is / are** many color pencils in the pencil case.



There **is / are** a flower in the pot.



We write **THERE IS** with

some / numbers (3, 5, 8)

We write **THERE ARE** with

a / an

REMEMBER: "a/an" means one. Use "a" with a word starting with a consonant (e.g. a car, a dog, etc.), and use "an" with a word starting with a vowel (e.g. an elephant, an airplane, etc.).
