

Questions in the Past Progressive

There are a few ways to form questions in the past progressive (past continuous) verb tense.

One way is to move the "was" or "were" to the beginning of the sentence.

Ex: Ruben **was sleeping** at 11 pm last night. → **Was** Ruben **sleeping** at 11 pm last night?

Another way is to add a question word to the beginning of the sentence. The "was" or "were" still moves in front of the subject.

Ex: Martin was reading the newspaper. → **What** was Martin reading?

Joseph was running late because he missed the bus. → **Why** was Joseph running late?

Cassie was going to work. → **Where** was Cassie going?

Ruben was sleeping at 11 pm last night. → **When** was Ruben sleeping?

They were driving quickly. → **How** were they driving?

Pam was calling me all night. → **Who** was calling me all night?
