

# Spelling Rules -ing



Match the spelling rule with the examples.

If the verb ends in an **e** we remove the **e** and add **ING**.

sleeping

If the verb ends in a consonant + vowel + consonant, we **double** the final consonant and add **ING**.

snowing

If a two-syllable verb ends in a consonant + vowel + consonant, we **do not double** the final consonant when the *stress* is on the first syllable.

living

The general rule when changing a verb into its - **ING** form is just to add **-ING** to the end of the verb.

planning

We **do not** double the final consonant when the verb ends in **W, X or Y** or when the final syllable is not emphasized.

tying

If the verb ends in **ie** we change it to **YING**.

entering

If the verb ends in **consonant + vowel + L**, we normally double the final **L** and add **ING**. GB

deferring

Note: In the United States us they do not double the **L** when the *stress* is on the first syllable.

marvelling

If the verb ends in a stressed vowel + **r**, we double the final **R** and add **ING**.

Add **-ing** to the verbs, following the spelling rules of the previous exercise.
