Writing Tips for Part 6

- Read the instructions carefully.
- Look at **WHAT TYPE** of message you are sending.
- Make sure **WHO** you will send the message to.
- Look at **WHAT** you need to put in the message and think about what you are going to say.
- You must write some text for **ALL THREE** instructions.
- Write your message on a different piece of paper and when you are happy with it, write it on your answer sheet.

Suggested Structure & Writing Ideas

- Ask Adam if he wants to go to the cinema with you on Saturday.
- Say what film you want to see, and say something about the film.
- Say how you can get to the cinema.

SAMPLE ANSWER - Question 31

Hi Adam,

Would you like to come to the cinema with me on Saturday? There's a really funny comedy on, and I know how much you like comedies. If you want to see it, I'll pick you up from your house at 5pm. Let me know today.

Writing Tips for Part 7

- Read the instructions carefully.
- Look at the three pictures and decide what is happening in each of them.
- Think about what information you will need.

- Write your ideas on a different piece of paper before writing on the answer sheet.

Suggested Structure & Writing Ideas

- Write where the children were and what they were doing in the first picture.
- Write about the weather.
- Write what they were doing in the second picture.
- Write what they decided to do in the end.

SAMPLE ANSWER - Question 32

Jane met Dan outside. The weather was bad. Jane was holding an umbrella because it was raining a lot. Then they decided to go inside and play chess. The weather was still bad. It was still raining. Then they felt bored playing chess and they decided to go to the cinema.

Useful Vocabulary

- * Use words relating to weather:
rain, rainy, windy, wet, umbrella, bad weather
- * Use phrases like:
it was raining hard/heavily/a lot
- * Use phrases like:
they went inside, they decided to play chess / play a board game / go to the cinema
