Do they have red hair?

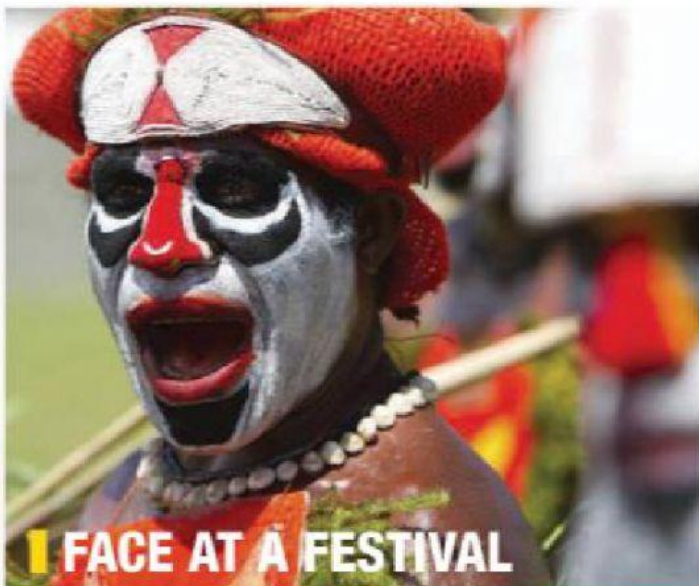
Yes, they do. / No, they don't.
