IV. Another reason that the chicken pox vaccine was not immediately accepted by parents centered on observations made by scientists that the vaccine simply did not last long enough and did not offer **permanent** immunity. In other words, scientists considered the benefits of vaccine to be temporary when given to young children. They also feared that it increased the odds that a person could become infected with chicken pox later as a young adult, when the rash is more painful and **prevalent**, which can last up to three or four weeks. Hence, allowing young children to **develop** chicken pox rather than take a vaccine against it was believed to be the “lesser of two evils”. This idea varied over time as booster shots of the vaccine can enhance immunity and **diminish** the perceived limits.
