

Multicultural Society



The society of Al-Ándalus was very diverse and consisted of people from different religious groups. Most people were Muslim but other religious groups practiced their religion and traditions, too. Some people came from mixed Christian and Muslim families.

Muslims

Muslims followed Islam and were the most powerful group in society at the time. They owned the best land and were in charge of the government. One of their traditions was the Hajj, which is a yearly Islamic pilgrimage to Mecca, the holy city for Muslims.

Muladí's

Muladí's were Christians who converted to Islam and adopted the Moorish customs and Islamic traditions. Some of them followed the Muslim religion to avoid paying taxes.

Mozarabs

Mozarabs were Christians who kept their religion but adopted Moorish customs.

Jews

There were a small number of Jews in Al-Ándalus, but they played an important role in politics, commerce and art. They kept their own customs and lived in separate areas called juderías.

The Muslims of Al-Ándalus were respectful of other people's beliefs. They allowed Christians and Jews to practice their religions, but they had to pay a tax called jizyah. Muslims, Christians and Jews often lived peacefully in Muslim cities.
