In 1901, 55% of the population in Australia was under 25 years old, just 29% were over 35 and only 4% were over 65. By 2000, half of all Australians were at least 35 and the over 65s formed 12% of the population. In general, Australians are now living in bigger cities. A hundred years ago, almost half the population lived in the country or in towns of under 3,000 people. Although one in three Australians lived in a city in 1906, even the biggest cities only had small populations (538,800 in Sydney and 526,400 in Melbourne). In 1996, 53% of Australians lived in a city of around or more than a million people. The roles and rights of women have developed a lot. More women are working than ever before and the traditional view of a man's role primarily as 'breadwinner' and a woman's as 'homemaker' has changed.
