USE

- As the subject of a sentence:
* *"To vote in an election is very important."*
- (However, it is more commonly used in IT sentences):
* *"It is very important to vote in an election."*
- With TOO and ENOUGH:
* *"This table is too heavy to carry"*
- After most common adjectives:
"I'm sorry to see you like this" / "He's determined to find a job"
- With verbs followed by a (pron)noun + infinitive:
* **advise, allow, ask, beg, cause, challenge, convince, dare, encourage, expect, forbid, force, hire, instruct, invite, need, order, permit, persuade, remind, require, teach, tell, urge, want, warn**
