Exercise 1: Choose the best option to finish the sentences: Second conditional

6. I would go on a diet if the doctor told me to do so / if I didn't have to.
7. If I could choose anywhere in the planet to go on holiday, I would go to Ibiza / I would went to Ibiza.
8. If I had more free time, I would spend it with my family / I spent it with my family.

1. If Elizabeth (not/lose) her job as a sales representative in Madrid, she (not/move) to Munich.
2. If he (not/move) to Germany, she (not/find) a job in a new company.
3. If she (not/find) a job in the new company, she (not/meet) Johnny.
4. If she (not/meet) Johnny, they (not/fall) in love.
5. If Brad's alarm clock (ring) on time, he (have) time to have breakfast at home.
6. If he (have) breakfast at home, he (feel) more relaxed.
7. If he (feel) more relaxed, he (not/drive) so fast.
8. If he (drive) slowly, he (see) the "STOP" sign.
