London Zoo was opened in 1827 by the Zoological Society of London. It's the world's oldest scientific zoo. People built the first cages to reflect the places where animals lived. Queen Charlotte moved the first zebra to the zoo. King Henry III brought some exotic animals to Britain in the thirteenth century.

Today there are more than 8000 animals in the Zoo. Some are very rare, such as the giant Panda. Many of the animals were born in the Zoo, or in other zoos around the world.

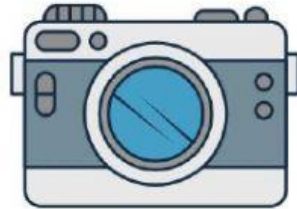
