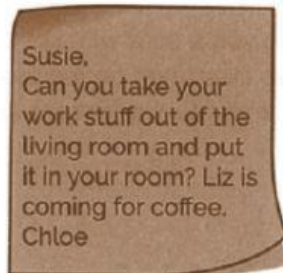

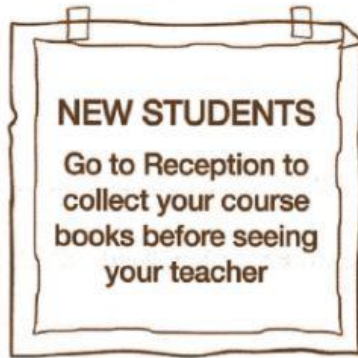

Someone has looked after these beautiful old instruments that are two or three hundred years old. I think that's amazing.'
