Evolution of social networks

The first social networks appeared in the USA in the late 1990s with sites like *Classmates* (1995) which helped people find old school friends and *sixdegrees* in 1997, but it wasn't until the arrival of *Friendster* in 2002 that social networking really took off. A year later the more serious *LinkedIn* started and immediately became popular with business people and professionals, and this is still true today.

However, it wasn't until the creation of MySpace in 2003, followed by Facebook in 2004, that social networks went global. With over 830 million users worldwide, Facebook has become the leader everywhere except in Russia and China, followed by Twitter with 140 million users. In the UK alone, Facebook has 30 million users – an incredible fifty per cent of the population. It seems that Facebook is replacing other social network sites like MySpace and Friendster.

The overall statistics don't show the whole picture because different networks appeal to different types of people. Although Facebook is number one in the UK, many teenagers still use Bebo. Research has shown that the average Facebook user is older and richer and more likely to be married than users of Bebo and MySpace. Twitter users are also older and more interested in politics and news.

Around twenty per cent of the world population now use social networks, with Facebook dominating, but this may not last. In the US, the fastest growing site is *Pinterest*, where people can share photos of their interests. The social media scene is constantly changing as people look for new things, so nobody knows which networks will dominate tomorrow.
