

Comparing with *More* and *Most*

REMEMBER THE RULES

- Use **more** to compare two people, places, or things.

*I think hiking is **more enjoyable** than swimming.*

- Use **most** to compare more than two.

*I think hiking is the **most enjoyable** of all outdoor activities.*
