

Expressing **FUTURE** with...

**when** \* **as soon as** \* **as long as** \* **until**



**when PRESENT** ►► **I ... FUTURE**

When she comes back, I **will** tell her.

Or:

I **will** tell her **when** she comes back.

As soon as I arrive, I **will** call you.

Or:

I **will** call you **as soon as** I arrive.

Until you apologize, I **will** not talk to you.

Or:

I **will** not talk to you **until** you apologize.

**Attention:**

this rule does **not** apply if WHEN stands for its proper meaning

→ **At what time? Tomorrow? Next week? Etc.**
