

Expressing **FUTURE** with...

when * as soon as * as long as * until



when **PRESENT** ►► **I ... FUTURE**

When she comes back, I will tell her.

OR:

I will tell her when she comes back.

As soon as I arrive, I will call you.

OR:

I will call you as soon as I arrive.

Until you apologize, I will not talk to you.

OR:

I will not talk to you until you apologize.

Attention:

this rule does **not** apply if WHEN stands for its proper meaning
→ At what time? Tomorrow? Next week? Etc.
