ACTIVITY 1: READING. FOR ATHLETES THE DOORS ARE OPEN

If you are an excellent young athlete, you might want to consider studying at a university in the United States. You've got a good chance of being accepted. You may even get a scholarship that will finance your studies and living expenses.

Each year, university coaches in the United States look for first-rate athletes from around the world for their teams. These athletes represent their university and are an integral part of campus life. Sports scholarships (only given to athletes who will play in university teams), are much more common in the United States than in any other country. Moreover, many universities give athletes preference in their admissions policies by reserving a certain percentage of spots for them each year.

Critics who are against these special privileges argue that they put other, more academically-qualified, applicants at an unfair disadvantage. The policy of reserved spots means that all other applicants are then left to compete for a limited number of remaining places. Moreover, athletes are sometimes admitted despite having lower marks than those required of non-athletes. The true purpose of universities is intellectual and research-based, so that academic standards should not be compromised for the sake of sport.

Policymakers answer these arguments by saying that sport adds to the variety and excitement of campus life. Athletes are expected to keep up with their studies, and their scholarships are discontinued if they do not meet academic requirements. Most importantly, athletic scholarships provide an education for people from minorities and low socio-economic backgrounds who would otherwise not be able to afford one.

Whichever side you agree with in principle, these arguments needn't concern you if you are a European athlete thinking of applying to a university in the United States. Studying in the United States while playing university sports is a fabulous opportunity that can lead you into professional sport. A university degree from the United States will also benefit your career in any other profession you choose, at home or abroad.

ACTIVITY 2: READING. WILD CHILDREN.
