USES OF THE -ING FORM

We use the -ing form...

1 as the subject of a sentence:

2 after a preposition. When a verb follows a preposition, it is always in the -ing form:

Note: in some expressions/phrasal verbs, to is used as a preposition (e.g., get used to, look forward to): I'm looking forward to using it again.

3 after certain verbs, e.g., avoid, consider, enjoy, hate, imagine, like, love, practice:

4 after an article or my, your, his, etc:

5 after "no" on warning notices: No swearing!
