d) Australia and New Zealand	m	People eat mashed yams with eggs and onions.
e) Brazil	w	They receive their first haircut in their 3 rd birthday
f) Hungary	b	First people to celebrate their family and friends' birthdays.
g) Great Britain and Ireland	v	The 1 st , 5 th , 10 th , and 15 th birthdays are the most important.
h) U.S.A.	u	People make big celebrations every five years until the 21 st birthday
i) Canada	f	At their 21 st birthday, they receive a key as a symbol of responsibility and the future.
j) Nepal	d	They decorate white bread and butter with "hundreds-and-thousands"
k) Mexico	h	Small cakes are given to babies to smash them and make a mess.
l) China	s	People celebrate <i>Quinceañeras</i> as the beginning of womanhood.
m) Ghana	f	People pull the earlobe of the birthday child singing a good luck chant
n) Vietnam	k	People sing <i>Las Mañanitas</i> before eating the cake.
o) Korea	p	Saying "Happy Birthday" before the date is considered bad luck
p) Germany	c	A flag outside the home means that it's somebody's birthday.
q) Jamaica	o	First birthdays are celebrated on the date of birth but all subsequent birthdays are celebrated in New Year.
r) Judaism	l	People eat <i>Yi Mein</i> or "longevity noodles"
s) Latin American	g	The birthday child is lifted and bumped once per year of life.
t) South Africa	q	People throw flour on the head of the birthday person.
u) Holland	n	All people's birthdays are celebrated on the holiday of <i>Tet</i>
v) Nigeria	r	People celebrate ceremonies representing a move into adulthood.
w) Orthodox and Hasidic Jews	j	Put colored rice yogurt on the forehead on your birthday for good luck
