## Past Simple

Form: we add "ed" to all regular verbs, Irregular verbs must be learnt by heart.

We use the Past Simple for something in the past which is finished.

- · He played tennis yesterday.
- · The children went to the park this morning.

We use "did" to make questions and "didn't" for negatives. The verb stays in the base form.

- Did you see Bob yesterday?
- They didn't come to the party on Sunday.

## Present perfect

Form: has/have + past participle

We use the present perfect for an action in the past with a result now or when we talk about a time from the past until now.

- I've lost my glasses. (I can't find them now)
- . I've been to Spain, but I haven't been to Portugal.

We use: hasn't/haven't + past participle for negatives:

· John hasn't seen the film.

We use: has/have + subject + past participle for questions:

Have you seen Jane today?
