REMEMBER



We use **PRESENT CONTINUOUS** to talk about future arrangements; things that aren't happening at the moment of speaking, but in a near future.

We use **BE GOING TO** to talk about future plans and intentions. We also use it to talk about predictions based on evidence in the present.

We use **WILL/WON'T** to talk about predictions (without evidence) and also it is used for instant decisions.
