THE ABOLISHMENT OF UPSR AND PMR FROM EDUCATION SYSTEM

Scoring rather than learning become the only objective for students when they are in school. The same thing has been emphasized by their parents and teachers. This scenario is generated by three public examinations conducted in Malaysia's education system. Having "Ujian Penilaian Sekolah Rendah"(UPSR)," Penilaian Menengah Rendah"(PMR) and Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia"(SPM) may be too much for the students.
