- Simple past tense shows us what **happened or completely finished** in the **past**.
 - Most verbs **form the simple past tense with “-ed”**. They are **regular verbs**.
 - Some verbs **DO NOT** form the simple past tense with “-ed”. They are **irregular verbs**.
- Some sentences in the simple past tense have **words or phrases** that tell us when a particular action happened.
 - Jack and Jill **bought** a new pail **yesterday**.
 - Alice **left** Wonderland **six months ago**.
 - Cinderella **lost** her shoe again **last night**.
 - Mary **took** her lamb to school **just now**.
 - Goldilocks **straightened** her hair **a few days ago**.
 - Snow White **went** to a party **last Sunday**.
 - Little Red Riding Hood **signed** up for karate lessons **last week**.
 - I **met** the Little Mermaid on the beach **last month**.
