

1. Zero conditionals

The zero conditional is a sentence that is used to express general truths or situations that one always leads to the other

Formula:

If + Conditionals + Result

If + Simple present tense + Simple present tense

Examples:

1. If I cry, I have a headache
2. If it rains, the ground gets wet

First conditional

The first conditional is used to talk about possibilities in the present or the future.

Formula:

If + Present simple + simple future(s+will/won't+V(bare form))

Examples:

1. If it rains, I will stay at home
2. If Pedro leaves, Juan will be sad
