John James Audubon

John James Audubon was a famous painter and bird scientist. He was born in Haiti in 1785, but he grew up in France. When he was a child, he enjoyed painting and nature, and he really loved birds. He also played the violin.

When Audubon was 18, Napoleon was the leader of France. At that time, Napoleon told all the young men in France to join the French army.* Audubon didn't want to be in the army, so he went to the United States.

Audubon lived on a large farm near Philadelphia. There, he started to study birds. He started painting pictures of them, too. Audubon's paintings were special because they were very detailed.* He also studied how the birds moved and lived.

Later, in 1808, Audubon moved to Kentucky. He owned a store there, but he still painted pictures of birds in his free time. Audubon's store didn't make enough money, so he closed it in 1819. He decided to travel down the Mississippi River. On the way, Audubon painted pictures of the birds that he saw. His biggest dream was to paint pictures of all the different kinds of American birds.

In 1826, Audubon went to England and took his paintings with him. He had over 300 pictures. The people in England loved his paintings, and he became very popular there. In 1827, Audubon published* a book called *Birds of America*. Today, there are only 120 of these books in the world, and some of them were sold for millions of dollars each.
