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Limited face-to-face college classes allowed in MGCQ areas

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Higher education institutions (HEIs) are allowed to conduct face-to-face classes but at a limited capacity.

In areas under the Modified General Community Quarantine (MGCQ), HEIs may resume face-to-face classes as the implementation of the community quarantines, the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases has allowed residential classes at the tertiary level.

However, they must still comply with minimum health standards to combat the spread of the coronavirus disease (COVID-19).

"Limited face-to-face or in-person classes may be conducted in HEIs provided there is strict compliance with minimum public health standards, consultation with local government units, and compliance with guidelines set by CHED (Commission on Higher Education)," the guidelines read.
