Simon Bolívar

Simón José Antonio de la Santísima Trinidad Bolívar y Palacios born in Caracas on July 24, 1783 in Venezuela. His parents Juan Vicente Bolívar y Ponte and María de la Concepción Palacios y Blanco. His wife María Teresa del Toro.

Simon Bolívar was sent to be educated abroad at a young age. While in Europe he introduced to Napoleon Bonaparte's ideas of liberation and struggle, which later motivated him to liberate America from Spanish Empire.

Bolívar began its activities for independence in 1808. He was a Venezuelan leader, who played a key role in the revolutions against the Spanish Empire. Through military campaigns, he expelled the Spanish rulers of Ecuador, Peru, and Bolivia. He was president of Gran Colombia (today Venezuela, Colombia, Panama and Ecuador), Peru and Bolivia.
