Orangutan mums carry their babies everywhere for up to five years. They also hold hands with their young, known as **buddy travel**. Aww!

Great ape mothers!

Orangutans care for their young for **longer** than any other mammal, except humans. But the mothers don't just **protect** and **feed** their kids – they spend up to **nine years** **teaching** them how to be wild orangutans. They show them **what to eat** and **where to find food**, how to make tools, and **how to build nests** for treetop sleeping – and nest building is truly tricky, taking **four years of training!** With one of nature's strongest bonds, it's no wonder female orangutans keep coming back to visit their mums until they're **15 or 16**. Maybe they should be called **boomerang-utans!**
