7. Tom wouldn't like to hurt himself.
8. They shouldn't get lost.
9. You wouldn't lose your money.
10. They would like to learn to ski.

Have and Has (Present Perfect)

1. They've already lost their money.
2. You haven't gone yet.
3. John hasn't told about it yet.
4. Helen has already gone home.
5. You haven't started to write your homework.
6. She's already finished her exam.
7. We haven't been late yet.
8. They haven't elected the leader yet.
9. We've already won seven games this lesson.
10. Dr. Johnson hasn't left home yet.
