Making your own films

So you'd like to try being a film director and make your own film? Well, it may sound obvious, but the first thing you need is a great idea for the story – and that can be the most difficult bit. Ideally, it should be something that's never been tried before. So, this is probably the part of the process that will take the longest. Don't be too ambitious – you'll probably have a limited amount of money to get equipment. So a remake of a film like Star Wars is probably impossible – for the moment, at least! Then when you've decided how the story will develop, you'll need some costumes, and actors to play the different roles. You'll also need what are called props – items that are needed to tell the story. If the props that are essential to the story aren't available, you need to know that in advance. Otherwise, you might have to change your story halfway through. Another important factor is where you're going to do the filming. If your film set is actually your bedroom, remember to check with your parents that that's OK! On the day of filming itself, one really important thing to consider is lighting. Lots of homemade films haven't

worked because of poor lighting and you may find indoor lighting isn't bright enough. Even outdoors, you'll need some extra help, with artificial lighting. Very bright sunshine can help – but it can also create shadows where you may not want them. Also, one thing that doesn't look good in a film is if you can see the camera shaking in the film-maker's hand. Of course, that's fine if it's the effect you want to achieve. But if it's not, it can be really annoying for your viewers. So, you might want to invest in a very cheap stand for the camera to use in some of the scenes. But don't let it stop you experimenting with different techniques. Your first attempt at film-making isn't going to be perfect, after all, so use it to learn as much as you can. Lastly, adding music can be another really fun part of film-making. Make sure whatever you choose to add to your film really suits the scene, though. Unless it's what you want, you shouldn't choose happy, lively music to accompany a scary bit, for example! Your audience might like a bit of warning about what's coming next! But whatever you do – just enjoy it!
