## Walks For Everyone

<b>A</b>	<b>Mill Lane</b> You will see lots of animals on this way, because there is nothing to disturb them. Walkers often say they meet no one. There are places where you can join or finish the walk but these are not well signposted and it is easy to get lost.
<b>B</b>	<b>Sea Path</b> This walk starts at the village of Nye Flats and the excellent signposts lead you through local streets, fields and pretty neighboring villages. Although it will take you half a day, there are no hills at all. You can breathe the sea air and enjoy watching traditional life in busy villages.
<b>C</b>	<b>Cutters Way</b> This walk can take anything from 30 minutes to two hours. It's not a good walk for hill-lovers as the ground is completely flat, but it has a good signposts and simple facilities for the hungry or thirsty walker. A few places or things to see would improve this walk, which can be a little boring.
<b>D</b>	<b>Paddock Way</b> This is really a short track across a working farm. There are plenty of chickens and sheep to see, and the farmer turned some of the buildings into an educational centre with a café. Not a walk for those who like peace and quiet, but it is a good fun.
<b>E</b>	<b>Hurdles</b> This is a route for experienced walker. It crosses two rivers and includes hills of up to 500 metres, from which you can see the sea. There are several rocky paths that are unsuitable for children or older people and there are no shops so take plenty of water with you.
<b>F</b>	<b>Gold-Diggers End</b> You won't find any gold on this peaceful way, but you will find plenty of other things to see including a lovely garden which is open to the public. It's a half-hour walk with a couple of small cafés on the way.

All around the world, people are shopping more and more! And bigger and bigger malls are giving them more of what they want. How many shops do you think you can visit in one day? The Mall of the Emirates has 400, the West Edmonton Mall has 800, and finally the South China Mall has 1500! Don't worry, though – these monster malls also have hotels, so you can stay overnight and continue shopping the next day. In fact, buying lots of things is just the beginning. In addition to cinemas and restaurants, top malls offer everything from roller coasters to dance clubs, ski hills to theatres.

For many years, the West Edmonton Mall in Canada was the world's biggest mall. There are bigger ones now, but West Edmonton still says it is 'the eighth wonder of the world.' Shoppers usually agree. They especially like that you can shop both for quality goods and for bargains, depending on how much you want to spend. After shopping, you can try the high-speed waterslide at the World Waterpark and watch the dolphins perform in the indoor lake. Finally, you can sleep in the Fantasyland hotel, which has got rooms with themes such as Hollywood and Ancient Rome.

On the other side of the world, people come to Dubai for the sun, sand and sea – and for the Mall of the Emirates. Popular with travellers, it's got the world's biggest collection of brand names. People from England in particular will recognise many of their high-street favourites. There is also a centre for the arts completed with a theatre. Apart from that, the Mall of the Emirates is famous for its indoor ski hill. So when it's 50°C outside, you can go skiing on real snow inside. Don't forget your warm gloves.

Finally, The South China Mall is the world's biggest mall – so far. This Mall tries to be a mall for the world. It's got seven shopping areas based on different places: Amsterdam, Paris, Rome, Venice, Egypt, the Caribbean and California. Each area is so well done that shoppers feel like they are really in that place. For example, the security guards dress like the policemen in these different countries. Walking around a huge mall can be tiring, but at the South China Mall you can go by boat instead – the mall's got many waterways. Careful not to lose any shopping bags overboard!

Is there anything else you would like to do at a mall? With billions of shoppers around the world to please, these monster malls are just adding more and more attractions. Anything you dream of it, you can probably find it at a mall.
