Will there be schools in the future?

Yes, children will still go to school, but schools will be very different. There will still be teachers, but computers will teach some lessons. Some students will stay at home and learn in virtual classrooms. Virtual reality will give them an image of a classroom in three dimensions – or 3D. They will see their teacher and their friends, so they will feel like they are really at school.

Will computers understand what we say to them?

Computers will be more intelligent. They will understand what we say, what we think and how we feel. In the future, humans and computers will be part of a huge radio network. We will send messages from our brain to our computer and the computer will send messages straight to our brain, without using wires. When you want to learn something new, your computer will send the information straight to your brain.
