Tip 4: Plan your content in advance: Plan your content in advance: Natasha added that she was always on the lookout for new items to keep people interested.

Tip 5: Interact with your followers: Kevin Kelly from Denmark said that his audience had made him successful, so he always tried to answer their comments and respect their opinions. He explained that it could take a lot of time, but if you did just a little bit every day, it would add up and be worth it.
