INVERSION RIGHT AFTER ADVERB OF FREQUENCY (NEGATIVE MEANING) • Seldom • Rarely • Little • Barely / Scarcely / Hardly (ever) ... when • Nowhere (else) • Never (before) • Not (even) once • On no account ; In/under no circumstances • No sooner ... than • Not only ... but (also) • In no way • Only in this way E.G.: <i>Seldom do we play football on Mondays; Not only will you get a good result, but you will also be the best.</i>	INVERSION IN THE SECOND PART OF THE SENTENCE (NEGATIVE TIME ADVERBIAL EXPRESSIONS) • Not since • Not until • Only after • Only when • Only by • Only if E.G.: <i>Not until I saw them, <u>did I believe they had come</u>; Only if you have a nourishing diet <u>will you have a healthy life</u>; Only after trying the recipe several times <u>was she able to get the whipped cream</u>.</i>
INVERSION WITH SO & SUCH • So + adjective + that + consequence <i>So cold <u>was the water</u> that we couldn't go swimming.</i> • Such + inverted verb phrase + that + consequence <i>Such was the wind that we couldn't open the window. (The wind was such that we couldn't open the window.)</i>	INVERSION AFTER VERBS OF MOVEMENT / ADVERBIAL EXPRESSIONS ▶ Outside the house was a big pine tree. ▶ On the chair lay a cat ▶ Here comes the bus ▶ There she goes (not "There goes she" because she is a pronoun not a noun.)
