

You can combine two sentences that have the same subject into a longer sentence using the words **and** or **but**.

Combine the sentences using and or but.

Caro dropped her pen. Caro picked it up again.

I took my book with me. I did not read it.

The dog played outside. The dog ran a lot.

Diana sang well. Diana won first place.

You can combine two sentences that have the same predicate into a longer sentence using the word **and**.

Combine the sentences using and.

Sebas read the book. I read the book.

Fran liked the music. Gerald liked the music.

Sofi played with the cat. Sara played with the cat.

Dad watched the movie. Mom watched the movie.
