In 1928, he transmitted the first picture across the Atlantic and in 1929, the BBC and the German Post office began to broadcast TV with his system.



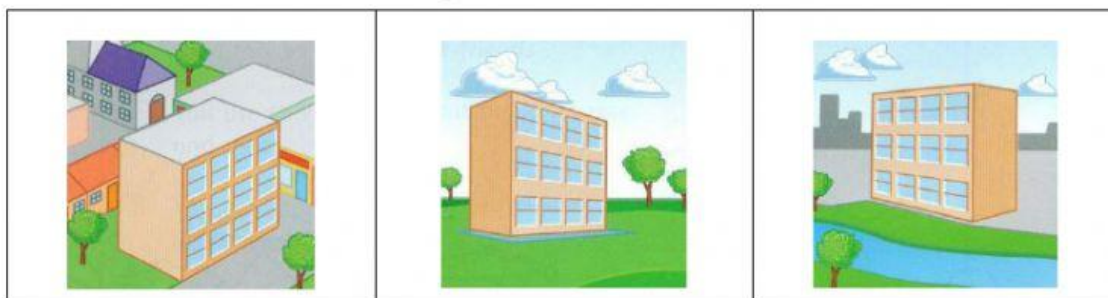
