11	Amazingly, she has forgiven him. The lovers are so happy to be back together!
12	To make amends for what he has done, Claudio must publicly mourn Hero's death and tell everyone she is innocent. He agrees to marry Leonato's relative. After he has married, he realizes that she is really Hero.
13	There is a big party and dancing as everyone comes together to celebrate the double wedding. All's well that ends well.


