

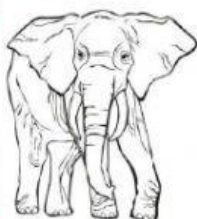
Adverbs and Adjectives

Hint: most adverbs end with -ly

An **adjective** tells more about a noun.

The elephant.

The **big** elephant



An **adverb** tells more about a verb.

This adverb tells us *how* the elephant walked.

.....walked

.....walked **slowly**.

Some adjectives can become adverbs by adding -ly

Adjective Adverb

quick

slow

..... angrily

happy

loud

..... stupidly

awkward

crazy

..... clumsily

Some are the same

Adjective Adverb

fast fast

Some are different

good well

Some change meaning

poor poorly
