

## ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY

100%	ALWAYS	Everyone <b>always</b> speaks well of Mark.
90%	USUALLY	She <b>usually</b> fed her cat cheap cat food.
80%	GENERALLY	A sentence <b>normally</b> has a subject and a verb.
70%	OFTEN	I used to <b>often</b> take walks along that road.
50%	SOMETIMES	Married people <b>sometimes</b> wish they were single.
30%	OCCASIONALLY	I <b>occasionally</b> eat meat.
15%	SELDOM	My father <b>seldom</b> watches TV at night.
5%	RARELY	He <b>rarely</b> makes a mistake.
0%	NEVER	I <b>never</b> forget a face.


**WORD ORDER**

Adverbs of frequency go:

a) Before ordinary verbs  
We **only** go out at weekends

b) After the verb *to be*  
He is **usually** late for work.
