

HOW DO YOU SLEEP AT NIGHT?

Present Simple

The dog often barks.

The dog often barks at night.

When the dog barks at night, it wakes up the boy.

When the dog wakes the boy up, the boy gets mad.

When the boy wakes up and gets mad, he screams at the dog.

Bobby screams and asks "Why are you barking so loud?"

After Bobby asks this question, the dog always stops barking.

After the dog stops barking, the boy goes to bed and sleeps.

Present continuous

Bobby is sleeping. Bobby's parents are sleeping.

Bobby's cat Catty and his hamster Hamsty are sleeping.

Is everyone sleeping? No, not everyone!

Who is not sleeping? The neighbour's dog isn't sleeping.

What is the dog doing? It is barking.

It is barking very loud at night when everyone is sleeping.

Now Bobby isn't sleeping, because the dog is barking.

Very loud. Bobby knows what to do.

He is asking the dog at 11:30: "Why are you barking so loud?"

The dog isn't barking anymore and everyone is sleeping again.

The dog is sleeping too.

The dog is sleeping and dreaming about the cat Catty.

The cat is dreaming about Hamsty.

Who is Hamsty dreaming about?
