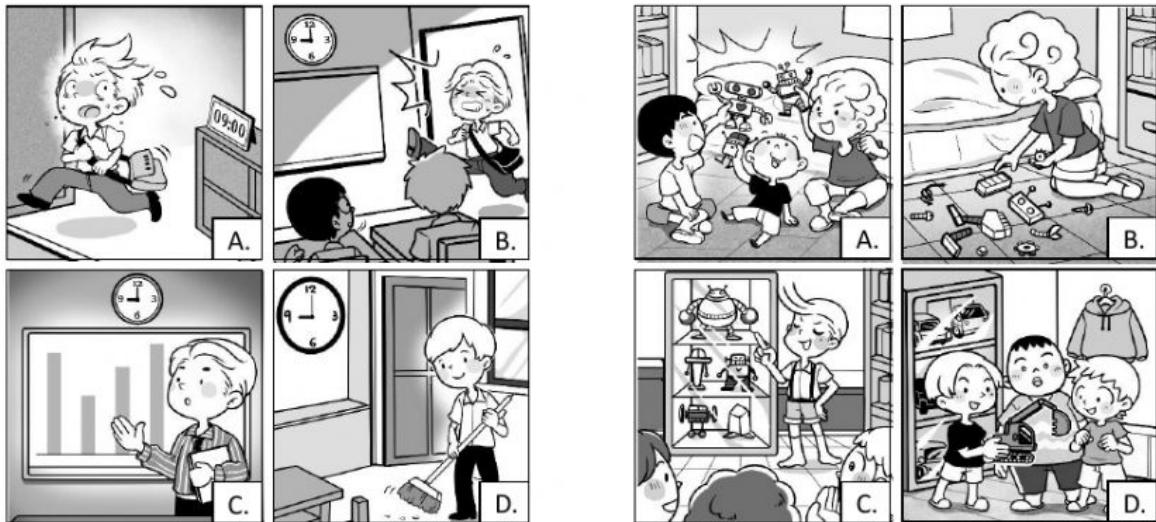

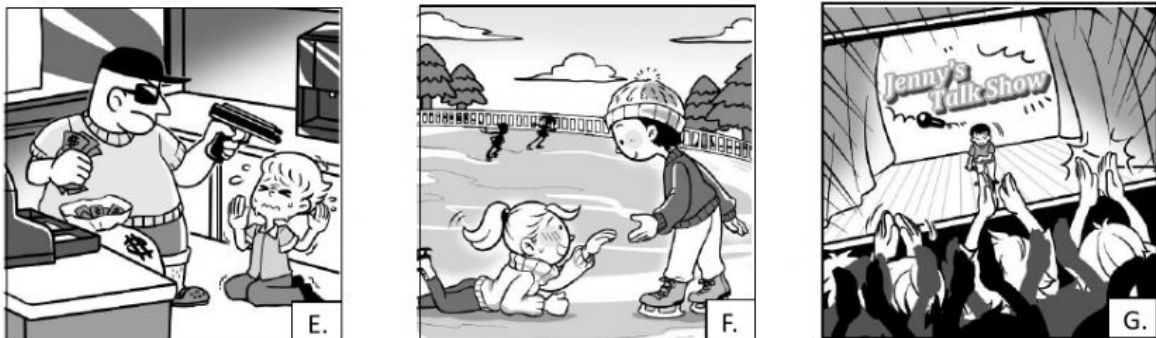

Have you ever been inspired by a TED talk? Abby Wambach, a hugely successful soccer player, was influenced by one \_\_ (1) \_\_ talk delivered by British writer George Monbiot.
